 - min 243, max 1470, mean 643







Discourse dynamics approach (Cameron & Maslen 2010)

- ➤ Delimit topics
- 1) Identify linguistic metaphors
 - ➤ MIPVU for English (Steen et al. 2010)
 - S-MIPVU for Norwegian (Nacey et al. 2019)
- 2) Sort them into vehicle groups
 - ➤ Compositional coding (Kimmel 2012)
- 3) Link the vehicle groups to their topics
 - ➤ Metaphor reconstruction (Silvestre-López 2020)


